Update from Sejal on COVID-19

Executive Director's Report

Update on Support for St. Patrick's Day Parade

St. Patrick's Day is coming up and is an outdoor event. Typically St. Patrick's committee asks for the DSA's help. This year they asked for new flags in the district. The flags we currently possess have run their course - half this year and half next year. We gave a \$2,000 sponsorship in 2020. Pat Mannion said last year's sponsorship will be applied to this year. Garbage clean up will possibly be high school students but DSA will have two people working to confirm garbage is not all over. RWJ Somerset will be recognized and will do their best to get people to be a part of the parade.



Update on ARP funding

Initial funding for grants will be longer than expected. Kevin Sluka was told by the county that the majority of applications were related to sewer projects. They are trying to navigate whose sewer project is better or greater than the other. It looks as though the DSA is the only municipality that has submitted something close to economic development. The DSA and DSA board is looking forward to getting word on these projects as these are some of our major projects for our committees.

Update on Public Art with WAG

The project we are working on is a large-scale installation on the courthouse lawn which is to be installed this year. Lea from the Weingarten group came out from Houston to do a walk through of the courthouse lawn. The DSA is hoping for an installation no later than June. A call is being scheduled to talk to the judiciary and county and courthouse this week to discuss any possible limitations of installation.
